
Politics: Canada has a new Prime minister

THE MYSTERY OF THE LOST TEETH




By Auriane Believe it or not, so far this year, almost all of the primary students have lost their teeth with one teacher, Heather. She is the kindest of all






the English teachers. But the question is, why do all of the teeth fall out with Heather?
